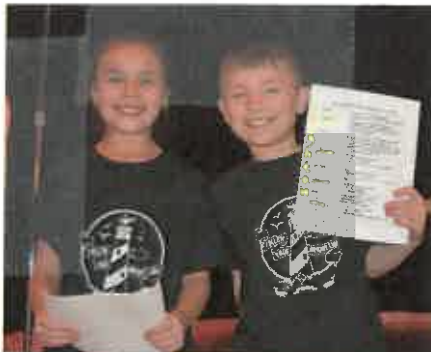

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# From the Office of the Superintendent

You Get What You *Inspect*, Not *Expect*

One summer during college, I worked for a commercial construction company as a general laborer. The foreman took the summer college help to a large office complex and told us all the laminate tile flooring needed to be removed. There were scrapers of all shapes and sizes. He told us we had three days to remove the laminate as the new flooring was on the way. After day two, he stopped back and informed us all our hard work had been for nothing because we had not done it right and did not meet his expectation. One of my co-workers reminded the foreman he had not shown us how to properly remove the flooring nor did the foreman follow up to make sure our work was meeting his standards as we progressed. This proved to be a teachable moment for us as employees and the foreman.

How can expectations be met unless there are inspections throughout the process? If someone is trying to maintain their weight, they cannot expect to guess how much they weigh in order to meet their expectation. They would need a scale to serve as a form of inspection. How often do expectations go without inspection? What expectations have you discussed with your children at home?

Are expectations in place for:

Perhaps more importantly, what forms of inspection are in place to help meet expectations? Are personal goals set, how is progress measured? Consider working with your children to put measurable steps in place to monitor expectations. You cannot manage what you do not measure.

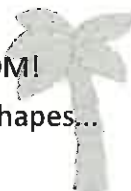

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## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents are asked to call the elementary office to set up a time for kindergarten screening which will be held on Monday, March 24, 2020. The Elementary office number is 419-293-3286. The child must attend the screening.

In order to register for kindergarten, a child must be 5 years of age by August 1, 2020. Perhaps you have a child of your own to register for the 2020-2021 school year or you may know a friend or neighbor who has a child to register. Please pass this information along to them.

The following items will be needed at the screening on March 24, 2020: your child's **Original Birth Certificate**, not the Birth Record from the hospital; Social Security Card; and Immunization dates. We must have complete dates: the month, day, and year of your child's immunizations. Children will need five DPT, four polio, and two measles, mump, rubella (MMR).

Also H.B. 140 now requires all children to have successfully completed kindergarten before being admitted to the first grade. Kindergarten attendance is now mandatory.
