Did you know that Honeybees are the only insect that produces food for humans? The Honeybee will produce honey worth over \$3.2 million each year. They pollinate 80% of flowering plants to help create about one-third of the world's food supply. Over \$15 billion dollars worth of crops in the US are pollinated by Honeybees including more than 130 types of fruits, nuts and vegetables.
